personnel in the "field", District Boards will assume a greater role and we are really pleased with this new model. Amidst the changes, there is much to celebrate as Bible distribution and grants by districts and national programs are all increasing.

We are excited about meeting a generation of children with the Bible-based online virtual world of YAHERO. I was recently at a conference where I watched as kids laughed and played on computers in this new online world. Through YAHERO, CBS is on the cutting edge — offering the Bible in a radical new way for kids, while also resourcing parents and churches with the tools they need in this digital world. We are growing boys and girls into heroes of the faith!

On behalf of all CBS staff, I offer a huge thank you for your support. I also covet your prayers for the months to come. Recently, I watched the Hollywood film "The Blind Side". After a long journey toward education, the main character, Michael, walked through the portals of his school and he observed the inscription, "With men this is possible. With God all things are possible." Let's imagine together all that is possible for the Canadian Bible Society as we rely on His counsel, His strength and His power!




God Speaks Through Spokes!



WHAT IS IT?

Literally translated, the word Bible means 'book' or 'books'. And it's a collection of books written over the course of more than 1,000 years.

Christians see it as one of the ways God has made Himself known—telling us personal things about Himself, His relationship with us and His overall plans for the world.

The Bible was written in three different languages and on three different continents. Its many authors include kings, prophets, fishermen, poets and musicians.

WHAT'S IN IT?

The Bible includes poetry, legal documents, songs, letters, eyewitness accounts, people stories, historical documents and advice.

Its subject matter goes from the creation of all things to the end of time as we know it.

For the time in between, it covers:

- God's relationship with the ancient Hebrew nation:
- · God's promise of a future deliverer;
- The life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ – the promised deliverer;
- The establishment and growth of the Church;
- Teaching and encouragement for those who are followers of Jesus.

HOW IS IT STRUCTURED?

The Bible is usually divided into two sections:

The Old Testament – texts written before Jesus Christ was born and covering God's dealings with the ancient Hebrew world and its people.

The New Testament – writings following the death of Jesus and covering His life and teaching, the establishment of the Christian church, and letters from church leaders.

Note: Christians are not entirely agreed on the number of books contained in the Old Testament. Protestants recognize 39, Catholics include 46, and Ethiopian Orthodox have as many as 54.

HOW MANY COPIES OF IT HAVE BEEN PRINTED OR SOLD?

The Bible is by far the best-selling book of all time. However, no one can be absolutely sure exactly how many copies have been printed, sold or distributed.

Bible Societies estimate the number printed between 1816 and 1975 to be approximately 2,458,000,000 – almost two and a half billion. Another survey, for the years up to 1992, puts it closer to six billion.

I thought I was in control – now I know God's in control!



Every Wednesday morning at 9 a.m. in the boardroom at MacKinnon Transport, a group of Christian employees gather to pray. At the same time, a couple of transport drivers are pulling onto the shoulder of the road to join their co-workers in prayer.

A few years ago, such a practice was unheard of in this office. But that was before Evan MacKinnon, President and CEO of MacKinnon Transport, was introduced to a totally new way of life.

"Ten years ago I made a number of sweeping changes in my life – changes that fostered a strong sense of spirituality that I had never before experienced. It was around the same time that I met my wife, Linda."

After a few years of spiritual growth and discovery, Evan joined Linda at her church in Waterloo, ON (Koinonia Christian Fellowship) and, in the fall of 2006, took a New Testament Bible study course.

"It was through that course that I met Jesus.

I have an addictive personality. If something is good I want more, which is why I've been grabbing every bit of knowledge I can – and why my faith has grown so much since 2006."

Since being baptized in 2008, Evan has been surprising people by sharing his faith widely. "I'm so much more calm and accepting than I used to be. Many of my employees feel comfortable chatting with me about their faith. A lot of people in the trucking industry have seen the changes in me which affords me dozens of opportunities to share my faith and new lifestyle."

When we think of trucks and truck-drivers, most of us just focus on the products that they deliver; however, Evan's focus is on the person behind the wheel with whom he can share his faith. In the company's quarterly newsletter, he reaches out to his office staff, drivers, customers and suppliers – fuelling them with his passion for God and His Word.

"I'm not a forceful Christian," says Evan.
"I accept other people's right to choose.
I sincerely believe that leading by example rather than through promotion is the way to win souls for Christ. St. Francis of Assisi said it best, 'Preach the gospel at all times and when necessary use words.'"

For Evan, the third chapter of Proverbs is a guiding light, particularly verses 5 through 9.

A flickering flame can be a thing of great beauty and endless fascination. At a restaurant, the light of a single candle sets the tone for a romantic dinner. In Ecuador's remote mountain villages, small flames are often the night's only source of light. Here at home, we gather around crackling campfires to sing songs, toast marshmallows, and make some of our best memories. But fire can also be a thing of devastating power—taking down an entire city block or a whole forest of mature trees.

They asked each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?" Luke 24.32 (NIV)

History shows us that fires have had a devastating effect on cities like London, Chicago, St. John's, Toronto and many more. On April 19, 1904, the Great Toronto Fire, which originated in a factory just west of Bay Street, destroyed a large section of the downtown core. It took nine hours to get it under control and the fire's glow could be seen for many kilometres in all directions. The weather fuelled the life of this fire with winds of 48 kilometres per hour. That day, firefighters from Hamilton and as far as Buffalo came to the city's aid. The fire destroyed 104 buildings and put thousands of people out of work. However, more stringent safety laws were put into place because of this fire and the city's fire

department was expanded to become a critical service.

Toronto firefighter, Jeff Hubbard, tells us that while fire does have incredible power, it definitely requires three elements in order to be strong:

FUEL – a material that will burn

HEATI – to bring the fuel to a point of ignition

OXYGEN – to keep the burning process going

Let's ponder the following analogies.

THE FUEL is the Bible's life-giving message that touches hearts – showing people just how much God loves them.

THE HEAT is our faith – an unwavering point of trust in Him and His Word.

THE OXYGEN is the Holy Spirit – igniting a powerful fire deep within our hearts to transform our lives.

TRANSLATION NOTE FROM HART WIENS

In this article, Marta discusses the power of fire. It is the enabling "oxygen" of God's Spirit that breathes and blows into the fire of God's transforming work. It is interesting that in the Hebrew Scriptures, which make up our Old Testament, the word "ruach" which we most often translate as "Spirit" also means "breath" or "wind". God's Spirit is the wind or breath, which provides the oxygen needed to breathe life into the transforming fire ignited by faith and fuelled by God's Word.

FANNING THE FIRE IN DR CONGO

Rev. Londroma Bandony knows all about fire and its destructive power, but he also knows what it takes to fan the spark that has been started in people's hearts. Back in 1998, as he worked on translating the Bible into Lenduspoken by one million people in the northeast – war broke out. He says, "When the war came, we had to flee. When we dared to return, everything had been stolen or burned, including the translation of the Old Testament that we were working on." Rev. Bandony and three colleagues, had to start the translation process all over again. Because the Bible Society can only pay half of their salaries, they must also have other jobs to support their families. He also explains that, before the war, many families owned a Bible in a language they could understand, "But when the war broke out, many Bibles were lost. People fled and when they came back, their houses had been burned and their fields stripped of crops. The situation is better now, but people are not replacing their lost Bibles because they cannot afford to or they are waiting for the new translation." Rev. Bandony works hard to fan the fire in people's lives as they wait for a copy of God's Word in the language of their hearts.

FUELLING THE FIRE IN THE MIDDLE EAST

While you read this, an amazing spiritual harvest is taking place among the 14.5 million migrants who went to the Gulf States to

find work. Many of those coming to faith are from India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Nepal and Somalia. And, as you would expect, they are desperate for the Bible in their own language. Believers from a hundred different nations meet in the desert late at night, to listen in awe to the Bible's message. In the Gulf workers' camps, Christian house groups have been springing up - fuelled by a passion and hunger to discover more about God. Prakash is a young man who became his family's sole supporter after the death of his father. He journeyed to the United Arab Emirates to join its booming construction industry. But then work began to dry up and many of Prakash's co-workers lost their jobs. He was gripped with fear and despair. At a prayer meeting at his workers' camp in the desert, Matthew 6.27 came alive for him - 'Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life?1At that moment, Prakash found peace in his heart and strength from God's written Word. Between shifts, some workers are serving as pastors – offering prayer and support to the people around them. Arulraj first arrived in the Gulf to work in the oil industry. Today, he has a different job as a chaplain in the migrant workers' camp – fuelling hungry hearts with the riches of God's Word.

IGNITING THE FIRE IN VIETNAM

Christians in Vietnam, where the Church has suffered much, receive copies of the Bibles at a price they can afford. How is this possible? It's because of a fire that was ignited in the heart of a priest more than 40 years ago. In 1970, Father Tin set up a team to begin translating the New Testament into Jarai. A short time later, he and his team were captured by Vietcong soldiers and taken to a Cambodian jungle prison. Throughout this traumatic experience, God's Word comforted the team. Every day, Father Tran Si Tin prayed that God would make a way for the team to complete the New Testament. After a year in prison, they were released and returned to the village in Vietnam. He immediately began work on the Jarai New Testament – working day and night until it was completed and published in 1973. Today, there are 41,000 Jarai Christians. Father Tin, along with a team of ten, is now working on a revision of the Jarai New Testament and the translation of the entire Bible. There are currently two Jarai Bible translation projects – one Roman Catholic and the other Protestant. The two groups meet regularly to exchange ideas and to discuss translation issues. The fire ignited by God in one man's heart has touched thousands of Jarai people in Central Vietnam – spreading an unquenchable fire of good news.

"Now God Speaks My Language!"



For decades, the Canadian Bible Society has been facilitating the translation of the Old and New Testaments into more than a dozen aboriginal languages spoken in Canada. While many people have contributed to these projects, for the past nine years Ruth Heeg, CBS Translation Consultant, has been shaping the Bible Society's native language translations, and her work has had an incredible impact.

Ruth, along with an Algonquin team, recorded an audio version of the Gospel of John in the Algonquin language. Upon completing the recording, Ruth edited and added musical interludes for emphasis. The recording received positive feedback from all who heard it and, as one Algonquin reviewer said, "This audio version will really be helpful for those in our community who have difficulty reading, and as they listen they too will be able to hear God speaking to them in our language."

Over and over again, translators have seen people overcome by emotion when they've heard an audio translation of God's Word for the very first time. Many have exclaimed, "Now God speaks my language!"

"Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word of Christ." Romans 10.17 (NIV)

Gospel of Mark launched in Plains Cree!

Most recently, Ruth worked with a team that has published the Gospel of Mark in Plains Cree. The Gospel, in both print and audio format, was launched in Saskatchewan at a ceremony on May 19, 2010. The lead translator, Rev. Stan Cuthand, who received the *National Aboriginal Lifetime Achievement Award* in 2009, is a Cree elder, Anglican priest, and recognized expert in his language. He works with a dedicated team to give his people God's Word in a format they can read and understand.

Hart Wiens, CBS Director of Scripture Translation, says, "Strangers don't live in your home. Strangers only come to visit. When the Word of God first came to the Cree people, it came in English and English was a stranger. Today, a newly translated version of God's Word comes in the Cree language and it is finding a home in their hearts."

China's Growing Church is Fuelled by God's Word!

The Church in China is growing faster than we can imagine! Church leaders share how thousands turn

to Christ every single day, with 500,000 baptisms every year. This is equivalent to over 450 average size Canadian churches coming to birth every month. These vibrant new believers have one thing in common – they all long for their own Bible. However, with such rapid church growth, there is a vast Bible famine. In some places, up to 100 believers share a single Bible.

Seventy-year-old Jin can't stop singing or smiling. "Reading the Bible is like having God talk to you," she says.

Jin earns her living as a watermelon grower, but

always suffered from travel sickness on the bus journey to the nearest town to sell her wares. "One

day I prayed, 'Lord, if you let me not feel sick on this journey, I promise to take whatever I earn today and

buy a Bible.' I didn't feel sick and I kept my promise to God. After a year, I was baptized and I changed my name." She adds with a smile, "It means God's love."

Years later, Jin walked for three hours in sub-zero temperatures to get to church. The reason? On this day, free Bibles were being given out to the congregation and she wanted one. This would be Jin's second Bible. The first was 20 years old, battered from daily reading, and missing a section of Genesis that simply fell out.

People like Jin are in need of God's Word to fuel the fire that's been ignited in their land!

The Wind The Shepherd

Many years ago when I visited my missionary parents in Spain, I met Ana, the daughter of a shepherd. She shared with us an inspiring story of how her father came to faith.

One day in 1948, a shepherd named Antonio Sanchez was tending his sheep in the pastures of southeastern Spain. On his way back home, the wind blew a piece of torn paper across his path. He picked it up and discovered it was a page from the Bible – John's Gospel, chapter 10 – the story of the Good Shepherd. He took the paper home and read it many times. Soon after, he decided to ask Jesus to be his Good Shepherd and, with a deep faith burning in his heart, he began his search for a Bible.

His wife and children also came to faith but the closest church was many hours away. For 10 years, Antonio and his family fed their faith by reading God's Word and praying together. They later moved to a city where they attended church faithfully. After being baptized, Antonio was on a life-long quest to know God better.

Antonio lived to be 94 years old and, ever since John Chapter 10 blew across his path, this dear man shared the good news about the Good Shepherd with everyone he met. His daughter Ana says, "The legacy that my father left us lives on in our hearts and I thank God that my parents became believers and shared God's Word with me. My favourite memories of my father are of him reading his Bible and praying."

God's Word continues to fuel hungry hearts all over the globe. But imagine with me for a moment if the page that blew across the road that day had not been in Antonio's heart language. He may have picked it up, but he wouldn't have been able to read it and consequently he and his family may never have received the Bible's message of hope.

There are still over 4,000 languages that don't have even one book of the Bible. It's for this reason that Bible Societies are at work – bringing God's Word to thousands who wait.

The Institute for Computer Assisted Publishing (ICAP) is doing significant work at the forefront of the delivery and support of computer tools. Today, 2,928 active Bible translators use the ICAP software tools in order to shave years off the time that it takes to translate the Bible.

With the advent of computers and the increasing reliance on electronic communications, CBS is using computers to literally blow God's Word around the world. They are linking translators with consultants – supporting Bible translation and ultimately enabling people to receive God's Word through media other than the printed page.

MALI'S MALINKE SPEAKERS WAIT FOR THE NEW TESTAMENT...

Over the past twenty years, churches have been planted among the 100,000 Malinke people in Mali. But their only Bible is in Barmanan – another tribal language – with many words that are too hard for the Malinke people to understand. The translation of the New Testament in Malinke is now underway. Soon, they will hear God speak to them in their heart language and they will know that He cares about them too.

ALBANIANS WAIT FOR THE OLD TESTAMENT...

In Albania, during the 50-year Communist regime – which ended in 1991 – the Bible was banned and burned. Today, the New Testament in modern Albanian is available for the growing churches. But they still wait for the completion of the Old Testament so they can have God's entire life-changing story.

When I picture that, I think of someone like Pio Osifera in the Solomon Islands. The launch of the Bible in Wala, ended

Pio's struggle to read the text in English, which to him was a foreign language. He says, "Reading the Bible in English is like climbing into a house built on stilts. Reading it in Wala is like having the house built on the ground and being invited to walk straight in."

This is why so many translators seek the help of ICAP to guide and support their Bible translation projects. It's why linguists and churches ask the ICAP team to work with them to create new translations and revise outdated ones. It's why Bible Societies work with experienced CBS consultants like Jeff Klassen in Kitchener, Ontario to advise and guide translators in their daunting task to bring new translations to life. Jeff says, "I have dedicated my entire adult life to developing and implementing innovative software tools for Bible translators, publishers, and computer support staff so that the Bible's message can be proclaimed to change lives."1The **CBS** Translation Department also anchors the task of training translators around the globe to use the ICAP tools - making a way for countless lives to be touched by the Good Shepherd.

What do you think? Was it an accident that Antonio, the shepherd, noticed a paper blowing in the wind that day? Was it just by chance that he bent down to pick it up? Was it a coincidence that it was a page from a Spanish Bible with the story of Jesus the Good Shepherd? I don't think so. The wind of the Holy Spirit blew across Antonio's path that day – bringing God's Word to fuel a hungry heart.

God desires to reach every single person on earth with His life-changing Word! However, many are not as fortunate as Antonio and they still wait for the wind of the Holy Spirit to blow God's Word across their path. It is for this reason that Bible Societies work tirelessly to provide translation software, and teams of people to get God's Word into a language that people can read and understand.



Scripture Questions Answered...

Hart Wiens is the Director of Scripture Translation for the Canadian Bible Society. With extensive knowledge of Scripture translation, Hart and his team provide valuable support to hundreds of translation projects. Hart welcomes your Scripture questions for the next issue.

What are we to understand out of all these references to "spirit"? Do some apply more to Christian thought?

Anna wrote to us to express her appreciation for recent articles in *Word At Work* and to discuss the challenges of coming up with accurate and meaningful translations of the Greek words for "blood" in the Bible. She requests a similar treatment of the various references to "soul" and "spirit". I have chosen in this issue to begin with a brief look at a few references to "spirit" in the Hebrew Bible (Old Testament).

When the word "spirit" occurs in what we call the Old Testament of our English Bible translations, it most frequently translates the Hebrew word "ruach" [רות]. Depending on the context, the Hebrew word can also be translated into English as "wind" or "breath". The word is so rich in meaning that no English term matches it exactly. It is interpreted in various ways in the Bible: as the spiritual existence of God as contrasted with the material. flesh

and blood existence of human beings; as the life principle; as the ethical principle; and as the divine spirit common to God and to the "sons of God".

One good example which highlights the difficulty of translating the Hebrew term "ruach" is found in Genesis 6.3, "My Spirit shall not always strive with man." Here, the reference is to God's spirit which is generally understood as "the power of God that gives life." Consequently, the NEB version seeks to bring this meaning to readers in a way they can understand by translating, "my life-giving spirit." Some newer versions are even more dynamic by rendering this as, "I won't let my life-giving breath remain in anyone forever" (CEV) or, "I will not allow people to live forever" (GNT).

The same Hebrew word "ruach" appears in 1 Kings 10.5 with a quite different and more metaphorical connotation. The context here is the Queen of Sheba's visit to Solomon's kingdom. After the Queen has visited with Solomon and seen the

splendour of his life-style and his kingdom, the text says, "... there was no more spirit in her" (KJV, RSV, NRSV). While this rendering is certainly an accurate and acceptable way of translating the Hebrew, it obscures the real meaning of the text. The meaning here is that the Queen of Sheba was "overwhelmed" (NIV). Another way to bring out this essential meaning is, "She was breathless" (CEV). Similarly, "It left her breathless and amazed" (GNT).

These are just two examples that profile the challenges of translating the Hebrew word "ruach" into English. While it does certainly mean "spirit", this rendering may be too narrow to capture the full meaning of the Hebrew. This is why reading the biblical text in more than one English version can often help us to capture its rich and life-transforming meaning more fully.

In our next issue, we will look at some references to "spirit" in the Greek text of the part of the Bible we call the New Testament.



A Proud Past. A Promising Future. Don Miller

DIRECTOR OF MINISTRY ADVANCEMENT IN EASTERN ONTARIO

"We're building on what our ancestors started."

Ask Don Miller what inspires him in his role as *Director of Ministry Advancement* in Eastern Ontario, and he'll tell you that it's the Bible Society's rich history. "I often think about the early days of the Bible Society and the passion of men and women for the Bible cause. In summer and winter they moved forward with conviction that God's Word changes hearts and lives."

Ask Don what excites him about the future and he's quick to point to the men and women of today whose passion for the Bible cause is equal to those of the past. "We're also blessed with a gifted group of people on the Board of Directors who actively participate in the work."

As a Methodist pastor for 17 years, Don felt a calling to join a small non-profit organization dedicated to resolving conflict. It was during this time that he met Brian Strom, who suggested to him a part-time job with the Canadian Bible Society, and within a short time the local cBs board offered him the job on a full-time basis. "Initially, it took a big step of faith for me to leave my pulpit but as God continued to open doors, I was able to step forward with confidence. That's what faith is all about."

In addition to providing speakers to local churches, the Bible Society provides Bibles for various celebrations. The Church in Kanata, known as "The Bridge", relies on the Society to provide "The Children's Bible" to families at the time of their children's baptism.

With the National military headquarters in Ottawa, the Society's Eastern Ontario office is very much in tune with the needs of our Canadian Forces. In its long history with the services, the Canadian Bible Society has developed a special Bible that is only available

through the military. An endorsement from the Commander in Chief of the Canadian Forces is featured prominently inside.

According to Don, "We're also trying to develop a special Bible for prison ministry. The Ottawa-Carleton Detention Centre, like so many other prisons, can give away many Bibles. We simply don't have the resources to meet the challenge, but we have a distinctive round table group who are developing a new Bible to address the need."

The staff of the Eastern Ontario office are particularly proud of their achievements in the sphere of *Proclamation*, the continual reading of Scripture that goes on for about 10 days, from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. It is with pride that Don talks about the longest running Proclamation, that took place in Brockville. In his own words, "This kind of an event brings spiritual life and vitality to a community."
